### THE BUILDING & ITS HISTORY

- o The Inn is a gracious 150-year old Victorian architectural gem, built by Augustus Littlefield in 1855, a Newport merchant ship fleet owner, as a private hotel for his ship officers and visiting merchants and traders
- o Listed on the National Register of Historic Places
- o Located on Pelham Street, America’s first gas-lit street
- o Land on which the Inn is built was originally owned by Rhode Island’s first governor, Benedict Arnold
- o Notable are its 27, 10-foot high round-top windows, overlooking a remarkable collection of historic homes along a historic tree-lined street
- o Believed to be Rhode Island’s oldest lodging house originally built and currently used for that purpose
- o Successively the property has been used as an Inn, boarding house, apartment house, illegal “bookie” parlor, rooming house – then converted to a bed and breakfast Inn in 1980 as the Admiral Benbow Inn (until 1999)
- o Named for Adele Turner, mother of Newport artist Beatrice Turner, the Inn showcases Beatrice’s art collection, punctuated by a majestic original oil painting of “Mama” over the main fireplace in the Inn’s parlor. The painting is the oldest surviving oil painting by Beatrice Turner known to exist
- o Dramatic \$1.5 million top-to-bottom renovation and redesign of the entire Inn 2000 – 2001 after purchase and re-opening by the Legendary Inns of Newport

### GUEST QUARTERS

- o 13 thoughtfully articulated guest chambers. Each room’s décor subtly reflects the notable men, women and legends which made Newport “America’s First Resort”
- o The guest quarters are grouped by 3 categories. There are 6 Classic Rooms, 5 State Rooms and Suites, 2 Deluxe Quarters. Classic rates \$125 - \$275. State Room Suites \$150 - \$345. Deluxe Quarters \$250 - \$525
- o All rooms have king or queen-size bed, gas fireplace and private bath. Each is accented with period antiques, fine linens, and artwork.
- o 4 guest quarters have 2-person whirlpool tubs, 1 also has a steam bath
- o The Harborview Spa Deluxe Quarter opens to a private roof deck with year-round hot tub and panoramic vista views of Newport Harbor and Narragansett Bay
- o The Tycoon Suite Deluxe Quarter unfolds 42 feet across the entire front of the Inn, and features canopied whirlpool bath with skylights, living room with fireplace and British library, iPod sound system with multi-room built-in speakers, Italian marble bathing salon with handcrafted double steam bath
